

Mountain-Southwest Regional Cohort

Career-boosting graduate-school opportunity
for young professionals working or seeking to
work in the thriving Jewish nonprofit sector.

60% of costs for qualified students.

Spertus Institute's **Master of Arts in Jewish Professional Studies (MAJPS)** is a world-class educational opportunity exclusively for professionals working in the Jewish community and those seeking to transition into careers in the Jewish nonprofit sector.

The MAJPS is offered in small-group cohorts (12–18 students) providing a network of fellow professionals with whom to connect, learn, and grow. The Southwest Regional Cohort is for students in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Nevada, Oklahoma, Texas, and Utah.

Courses are taught by creative, effective faculty who bridge theory and practice. Designed for busy professionals, the MAJPS is delivered through seminars, online learning, a yearlong mentorship, and a personalized capstone project. Coursework has immediate application, with projects designed so students can use their own institutions as learning laboratories.


Program Highlights
